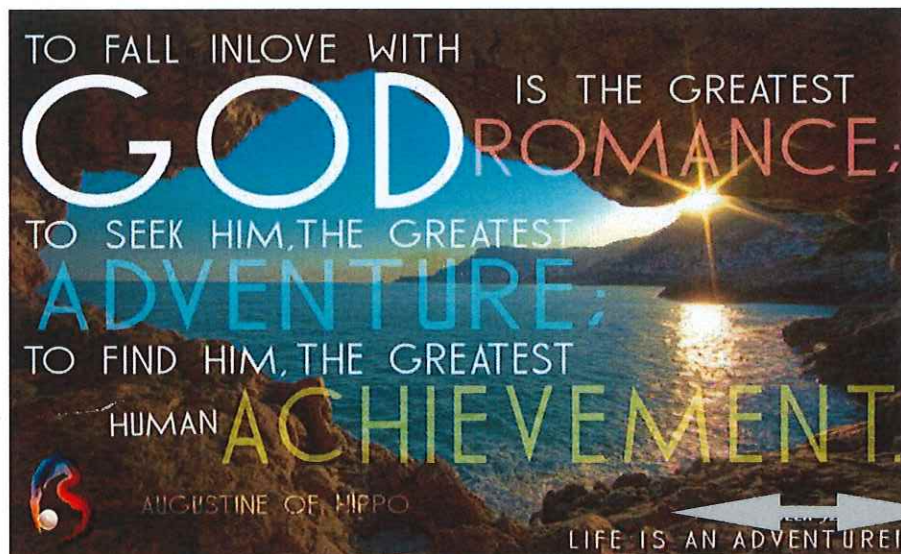

Mass Etiquette

Fast before Mass. It is Church law that one
fasts for at least 1 hour before receiving Holy
Communion. Water & medicine can be
consumed. The purpose is to help us prepare
to receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

Don't chew gum in church. It breaks your
fast, is distracting and impolite.

**Cross yourself with Holy Water on entering
and leaving the church.** This is a reminder of
our Baptism which made us members of
Christ's Church.

Dress modestly and appropriately.
