

The Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) met at a special meeting to look at some of the tougher issues arising in our society today and what we may be able to do to help. After a long discussion several proposals were put forward by the PPC

- 1. In order not to lose the bigger picture in our world, we will become closer to the Redemptorist Mission in **Zimbabwe** the Parishes, the outreach to poor and vulnerable children, and the training of our future brothers and priests.
- 2. At a very local level we will become a close partner a corporate sponsor with the **Ace of Clubs** who do tremendous work for the very poor and homeless.
- 3. We are proud to say that the **St Vincent de Paul Society** functions in this parish. The PPC would like to give it more focus and attention that it might go from strength to strength.

These three proposals need further investigation and detailed planning; however this is the decision of the PPC and we shall move forward with this model in mind.
